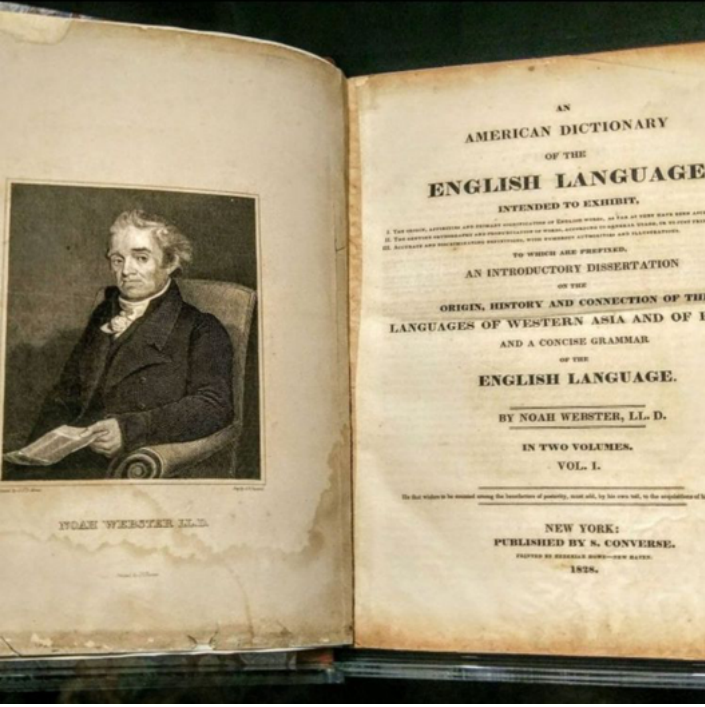


While we don't have flying cars, aerial technology is quietly transforming many industries, from e-commerce to medicine.
