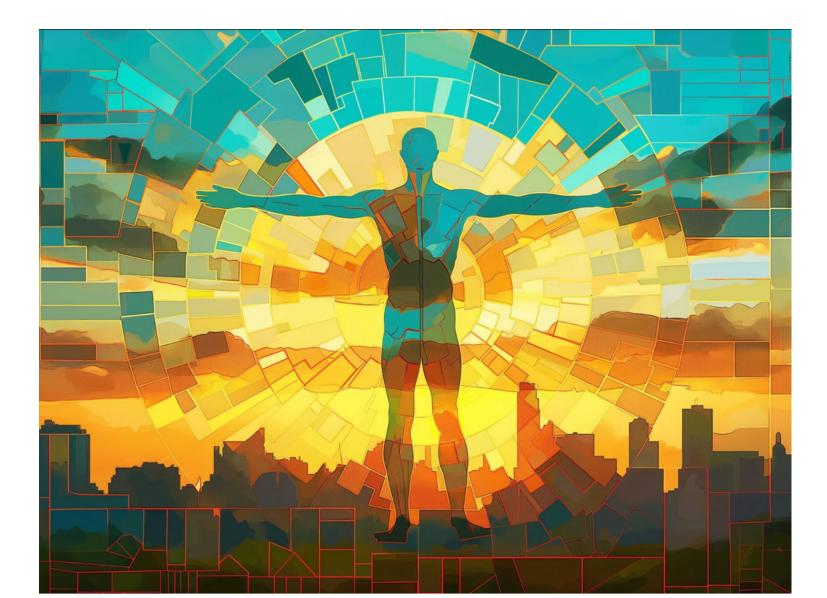

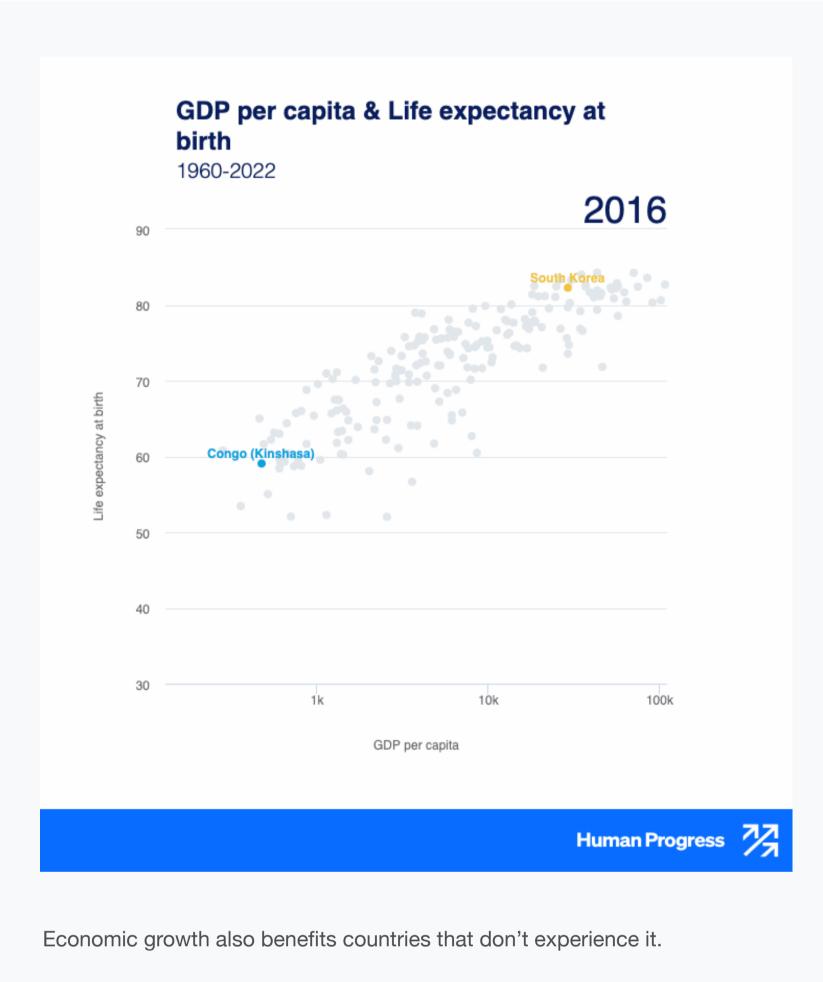
The Human Meaning of Economic Growth
